

Carlos Cardenas-Iniguez, Ph.D.

Dr. Carlos Cardenas-Iniguez (pronouns he/him/his) is a postdoctoral scholar in the Department of Public and Population Health at the Keck School of Medicine at the University of Southern California in Los Angeles, California. Dr. Cardenas-Iniguez earned his PhD in Psychology and Integrative Neuroscience from the University of Chicago in 2019 and served as a Social Sciences Teaching Fellow in the College and Department of Psychology. His research focuses on using the ABCD Study dataset to expose the impact of social stratification on the environments in which people live, and how these environments, in turn, impact neural and cognitive development and mental health. His research interests also include the implementation of environmental justice, critical race theory, and anti-racism principles in neuroscience/psychology research. He is a member of several professional societies, including the Society for Neuroscience, Flux Society, the Interdisciplinary Association for Population Health Sciences, the Society for the Advancement of Chicana/Latina and Native American Scientists, and the Society for Research on Child Development.
