Grant Limitations & Parameters

Lobbying: Recipients of federal funds are <u>not allowed to use said</u> <u>federal funds to lobby</u> federal, state, or local officials or their staff <u>to receive additional funding or influence legislation</u>.

- Specifically, grantees cannot use federal funds to:
 - Influence an officer or employee of any agency or Congressional member/staff regarding federal awards;
 - Influence an election, contribute to a partisan organization, or influence enactment or modification of any pending federal or state legislation; or
 - Influence federal, state, or local officials or legislation.



Opportunities

Education: Providing factual information on a program/policy is allowed as long as you are not attempting to influence legislation or funding.

- Coalition building: Among governments, nonprofits, the private sector, and community members to discuss problems and share ideas and best practices.
- Education campaigns: Factually explaining the advantages and disadvantages of public policies or programs
- Invitation to testify: Providing, at the request of the government or legislative body, technical or factual presentation of information to decisionmakers



State Opportunity to Educate

- If your program is housed within a government agency, the agency likely has a State legislative liaison.
- Provide program brochures for distribution.
- Offer support to constituents with Medicare questions and issues.
- Elected officials love data but keep it brief.
 - # of Medicare beneficiaries
 - # served by your program
 - LIS/Extra potentially-eligible
 - \$ saved by Medicare beneficiaries



State Opportunity to Educate

Invite agency heads and elected officials to events that share similar missions and/or support similar demographics.

SMP:

• Scam Jams: AG, Insurance Commissioner, and Secretary of State share mission in fighting fraud.

SHIP:

County outreach events: State Senators and Representatives,
County Commissioners, Mayors, etc.
