Jody Todd Manly, Ph.D. is the Clinical Director of Mt. Hope Family Center and Research Professor in the University of Rochester Psychology Department. She is on the leadership team for the TRANSFORM National Center on Child Abuse and Neglect, funded by NICHD. She is also the Principal Investigator for Sustaining Change, a SAMHSA-funded Treatment and Services Adaptation Center in the National Child Traumatic Stress Network, dedicated to expanding access to evidence-based trauma treatment models and sustaining trauma-responsive care. Dr. Manly has published developmental psychopathology research, specifically exploring linkages among child maltreatment, trauma, attachment, depression, domestic and community violence, and evidence-based interventions with a broad age range of children from infancy through adolescence. She has more than thirty-five years experience in providing clinical services to children who have experienced trauma and their families. She was honored to be appointed as Executive-at-Large for the World Association for Infant Mental Health (WAIMH, 2016-2020) and continues to be inspired by dedicated people around the world who are working on behalf of young children and their families.
