Susan L. Andersen, Ph.D.

Dr. Andersen is an Associate Professor of Psychiatry at McLean Hospital/Harvard Medical School in Boston, Massachusetts. She received her Ph.D. from the State University of New York in Binghamton. Dr. Andersen then went to McLean Hospital for her post-doctoral fellowship. She is currently the Director of the Laboratory for Developmental Neuropharmacology at McLean Hospital and teaches child psychiatry residents at Boston Children's Hospital. She is a board member of the National Prevention Society Coalition. Dr. Andersen is involved in numerous research projects including the study of the effects of exposure of psychostimulants on brain development, understanding the effects early life trauma on brain and behavior, and the effects of inhaled marijuana during maturation. She is a member of several professional societies, including the American College of Neuropsychopharmacology, the Winter Conference on Brain Research, and International Behavioral Neuroscience, and holds editorial positions on the Current Topics in Behavioral Neuroscience book series, Psychopharmacology, Synapse, and Frontiers in Schizophrenia. She has co-authored over 100 peer-reviewed papers, book chapters, and other manuscripts in the field of sensitive periods and exposure to drugs and stress during development.
