R. Adron Harris, Ph.D., University of Texas at Austin – Dr. Harris is the M. June and J. Virgil Waggoner Chair in Molecular Biology, Director of the Waggoner Center for Alcohol and Addiction Research, and he has been Director of the Training Program in Interdisciplinary Neuroscience at UT Austin since 2004. Thirty-four faculty participate in this pre-doctoral training program, now in year 13, with research interests ranging from the molecular, biochemical, physiological and electrophysiological, to the behavioral and computational. His own research is on the molecular sites of alcohol action in the brain, and molecular changes responsible for alcohol dependence, for which he has received numerous awards, including the VA Alcoholism

Research Award, the Research Society on Alcoholism Distinguished Researcher Award, the international Jellinek Memorial Award, and a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Texas Research Society on Alcoholism. Dr. Harris has been President of the Research Society on Alcoholism, and the International Society for Biomedical Research on Alcoholism, and served on the National Advisory Council on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism. Dr. Harris currently serves as director of the INIA Consortium overseeing 13 research projects across the country where the primary objective is to identify drugs for alcohol addiction that are in late-phase clinical trials or have existing FDA approval for other purposes.
