Hedy Kober, Ph.D.

Dr. Kober is an Associate Professor in the departments of Psychiatry and Psychology at Yale University. She hold additional appointments in the Cognitive Science and Interdepartmental Neuroscience programs, and is the Director of Yale's Clinical & Affective Neuroscience Lab. Dr. Kober received her PhD from Columbia University. Her research uses behavioral, clinical, meta-analysis, neuroimaging, and computational methods to understand the psychological and neurobiological mechanisms that underlie the craving and the regulation of craving in addiction, and addiction treatment more broadly. She is currently the PI of three NIDA-funded grants, as well as two private foundation grants. Although she is an early stage investigator, her work has already been published in high-impact journals (e.g., Brain and Behavioral Sciences, Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences, Biological Psychiatry), and is well-cited (7,335 times to date). Dr. Kober holds several editorial positions, serves in leadership positions for scientific societies, and has received multiple fellowships and awards including from the College on Problems of Drug Dependence, the Helmsley Charitable Trust, the Mind and Life Institute, the National Science Foundation, the Surdna Foundation, Yale's Center for Clinical Investigation (scholar award), and Yale's Center for Teaching and Learning (for teaching excellence).
