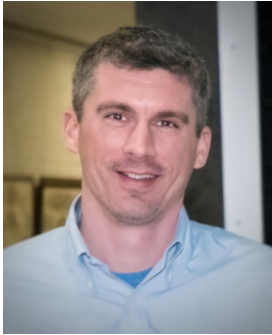


Matthew D. Albaugh, Ph.D.



Dr. Albaugh is an Assistant Professor of Psychiatry and licensed clinical psychologist in the Department of Psychiatry at the Robert Larner College of Medicine, University of Vermont. A graduate of Colby College, he received his doctorate in clinical psychology from the University of Vermont and completed his APA-accredited internship at the University of Vermont Medical Center. The focus of his research program has been to gain an understanding of how common emotional and behavioral problems, including substance use and abuse, are related to aspects of brain development in youths and young adults. He is an author on nearly 60 peer-reviewed publications in the fields of developmental psychopathology, substance use, and neuroimaging, with first-author publications in journals such as the *JAMA Psychiatry*, *Biological Psychiatry*, *Neuropsychopharmacology*, and *Journal of the American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry*. Dr. Albaugh is involved in several ongoing research projects, including a study utilizing machine learning methods to identify multi-modal predictors of psychopathology in adolescents and young adults, and another study aiming to characterize patterns of neurodevelopment associated with adolescent mood and anxiety symptomatology. He recently established a complementary line of research aimed at identifying longitudinal brain changes that may link adolescent cannabis exposure with adult psychiatric outcomes, such as anxious and depressive symptomatology. His research is currently funded by a K08 Career Development Award from the National Institute of Mental Health, as well as a Young Investigator Grant from the Brain & Behavior Research Foundation.
