






Developmental Changes in How Discrimination and Social Cohesion Impact and the Internalizing Pathway

How do offline social contexts interface with digital social contexts?





Take-Home Points

- 1. Cultural models that include experiences of discrimination are central for understanding social contexts for early drug use.
- 2. The internalizing pathway points to developmentally varying indicators of social cohesion and discrimination as contexts for early drug use related to persistent emotion dysregulation.
- 3. With COVID-19, social isolation may be a salient social determinant for early drug use onset that includes offline and digital contexts.
