

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Comprehensive Prevention Programming

- Target common risk factors
- Collaborate

- Intervene in multiple settings
- Address common risk factors



Summary

- Population-level change is not individual level change;
- Comprehensive prevention program must be ecological and multi-sector in nature, development, and implementation; and
